Do you have any extra items like pumpkins, leaves, or fabric scraps laying around? Donate them to your childcare or EarlyON Centre for upcoming crafts.



Trick-or-Treating Safety Tips

Costume Safety:

- Choose costumes that are bright and visible and ensure they are well-fitted to avoid tripping.
- Use face paint instead of masks for better visibility.

Light Up the Night:

 Carry flashlights or glow sticks to stay visible, or attach reflective tape to costumes for added visibility.

Plan Your Route:

 Stick to well-lit neighborhoods and familiar areas and avoid shortcuts through alleys or unlit paths. Only visit homes that are lit up and welcoming.

Check Treats:

 Inspect all candy before eating, discarding anything suspicious or unwrapped, and be cautious with homemade treats from strangers.
